# Overview

- 1995 - Arizona Assured Water Supply Rules Went Into Effect
- 1998 - Peoria Begins Strategic Diversification Effort -
  - *Construction of the Beardsley & Butler Wastewater Treatment Facilities = Recharged water for Long Term Storage Credits*
  - *Construction of the Greenway Water Treatment Plant to treat Salt River Project water*
  - *Collaboration and Partnership with Glendale to Expand Water Processing Capacity at the Pyramid Peak Water Treatment Facility = 47% Ownership of Plant by Peoria*
  - *Acquisition of New Water Sources from the Gila River Indian Community; Central Arizona Project; White Mountain Apache Tribe, the New River Utility Company*
  - *Funding and Commitments to Ongoing Operational Expenses; Maintenance and Repair; Water Conservation Efforts*
- Result – In 1998, 100% of Peoria's Water from Groundwater; in 2019, 5%
