

Stormwater Maintenance

“Stormwater” may consist of rain water, melted snow, and/or any other drainage traveling through a conveyance system, which infiltrates into the ground or nearby bodies of water, such as a lake, stream, or river. The Federal Government has mandated that cities take certain steps to ensure that Stormwater is not contaminated within the city. Therefore, it is vital that this water is not polluted as it travels the Stormwater System.

At the City of Peoria, Stormwater Operations help to keep the City’s Stormwater System clean by implementing routine repair and maintenance efforts on the following assets:

- 1) Mainline Inspection; Cleaning and Repair – Emergency and Routine Catch Basin Maintenance
- 2) Cleaning and Repair – Emergency and Routine Stormwater Manhole Maintenance
- 3) Repair of Street, Curb and Gutter Sweeping/Cleaning and Debris Removal
- 4) Open, Dirt, and Concrete Ditches and Swales – Emergency and Periodic Maintenance
- 5) Drywell Inspections with recommendations for Service or Replacement
- 6) Stormwater Retention Basins
- 7) Bridge Repair and Periodic Maintenance, as recommended by the State
