CONSENT AGENDA

1C MINUTES:

Motion was made by Councilmember Aames, seconded by Councilmember Leone, to approve the Subcommittee minutes from the June 25, 2012 meeting. Upon vote, the motion carried unanimously 3 to 0.

REGULAR AGENDA

NEW BUSINESS:

2R Feral Cat Control

Discussion ensued regarding the possible action to recommend approval for City Council adoption of a Feral Cat Control Ordinance. Consensus of the Council Subcommittee is to continue with the existing efforts of the Trap, Neuter, and Release program, as recommended by other agencies.

3R Permissible Number of Animals per Residence

Discussion ensued regarding the possible action to recommend approval for City Council adoption of an Ordinance amending the limitations on the number of domestic animals at residential properties.

Motion was made by Councilmember Aames to move this item forward to a full City Council Study Session for further discussion. Without a second, and upon vote, the motion died 2 to 1.

4R Feeding Nuisance Animals

Discussion ensued regarding the possible action to recommend approval for City Council adoption of an Ordinance that addresses residents feeding nuisance animals, particularly free-roaming cats and pigeons.

Motion was made by Councilmember Aames, seconded by Councilmember Leone, for Staff to present a draft ordinance at a full City Council Study session, which would address the feeding of unaltered and free-roaming cats. Upon vote, the motion carried 3 to 0.

Motion was made by Councilmember Aames for Staff to present a draft ordinance at a full City Council Study session, which would address feeding pigeons. Without a second, and upon vote, the motion died 2 to 1. Consensus of the Council Subcommittee is to increase community education efforts, to further discourage residents from feeding pigeons.
