FY2012 Usage Summary


- 146 different events were had at the Sports Complex

Volunteer Organization Extraordinaire

- Over \$209,000 was raised for charity through the Charity Game and other Spring Training efforts (parking, tickets, scorecards).
- The Kona VIP Deck was once again booked by the Diamond Club.
- New in 2013, PDC also booked a catering tent in left field, the 3rd base tent and stadium suites.
- Total giving, to date has topped \$1.4M for the PDC!




Recreation Participants FY2008-FY2012

The City of Peoria Veterans Memorial pays tribute to the past, present and future veterans and their families for the sacrifices they have made to protect our country, ideals and virtues.



The message is to every man and woman who have served in the armed forces that we owe our thanks for protecting our families and our country. The story will be told through graphics and narrative that will be etched into the surfaces of the monument.

Operation Overlord (D-Day)

June 6, 1944

American, British, and Canadian forces launch an amphibious assault at five points along the Normandy coast of northern France. After fierce fighting, and with the assistance of naval and air support and airborne landings, they secure a foothold, the liberation of France.

Chosin Reservoir

November 27 - December 11, 1950

Chinese forces launched a major offensive across the Yalu River into North Korea and encircled United Nations defenders, including the United States 1st Marine Division. Aided by Task Force Faith (part of United States 7th Infantry), which was decimated in the ensuing action, the Marines inflicted heavy losses as United Nations forces pulled back in the bitter cold. Before long, the front stabilized near the 38th parallel.

“ I would be great to see a mountain bike trail system with some long distance mileage rides available. Something like the City of Phoenix parks including Deem Hills, Sonoran Preserve - Union Hills and Apache Wash. The current trails at Westwing and Sunrise mountain are too short and narrow in many areas to enjoy on a bike. Bike parks with skills building sections including jumps like those found in Colorado (Valmont Bike Park in Boulder) for example would be an great addition to the City of Peoria.”
