THE DEPARTMENT

The Human Resources Department for the City of Peoria provides traditional human resources functions for over 1700 full-time and seasonal/part-time employees including four recognized bargaining units. The Department consists of 18 professional and administrative employees and has a \$2.3 million budget for staffing and operations, plus over \$13 million in health and workers compensation self-insurance funds.

THE POSITION

The Deputy Director of Human Resources will assist the Director in all facets of department operations and acts as Director of the Department in Director's absence.

IDEAL CANDIDATE

Candidates for this position should be exceptional leaders; energetic, passionate and committed to providing excellent human resources services to our customers. The ideal candidate will have broad knowledge and increasingly responsible experience in all functional areas of human resources. Previous managerial responsibility for a fast-paced, complex local government human resources department or division is desired. Possession of outstanding communication, problem-solving and organizational skills, and the ability to multi-task and quickly build trust and establish relationships within the organization is essential.

POSITION REQUIREMENTS

A Bachelor's Degree or equivalency, with a preference for a degree in Human Resources Management, Personnel Management, Public or Business Administration or a related degree. A Master's Degree preferred.

Seven years as a Supervisor, Manager, or Deputy Director responsible for a human resources department or division.

Certification as a Professional in Human Resources (PHR), as a Senior Human Resources Professional (SPHR) or as an IPMA-CP is preferred.

COMPENSATION

The City of Peoria has established a salary range for the position of \$93,459 - \$138,082 depending on experience (DOE). The hiring range is \$93,459 - \$117,325 DOE. The City offers an excellent benefit package, including a deferred compensation program, ICMA 401(a) and 457 retirement programs, as well as membership in the Arizona State Retirement System. A choice of Blue Cross/Blue Shield medical plans, vision, dental and City-paid life insurance.
