

MINUTES OF THE PEORIA CITY COUNCIL

A **Special Meeting and Study Session** of the City Council of the City of Peoria, Arizona was convened at 8351 West Cinnabar Ave in open and public session at 4:00 p.m.

CONSENT – New Business:

1C Authorization to Hold an Executive Session

Motion was made by Councilmember Carlat, seconded by Councilmember Evans, to authorize the holding of an Executive Session for the purpose of discussion and consultation with designated representatives of the public body pertaining to contract negotiations with employee organizations.

Upon vote, the motion carried unanimously 7 to 0.

STUDY SESSION AGENDA

Subjects for Discussion Only:

1. Centennial Plaza

Ed Striffler, Design and Construction Manager, led the discussion on the progress that has been made to the refinement of design to Centennial Plaza. The overall concept is for a multi-purpose mix of plaza, hardscape, shade walk way paths, turf and vegetated drainage basin.

Mr. Striffler discussed expansion of the amphitheater which will be known as the Grand Ellipse. Enhancements will include an ample shade structure which can be up lit during evening hours and shaded walking paths. The walkway along the west side of the Ellipse will depict milestones in observance of 100 years of Peoria and Arizona history. Mr. Striffler explained that provisions have been made to replicate the theme along the east side in order to mark future historical events.

Mr. Striffler concluded the presentation with a review of the project timeline and noted that construction of the Plaza is scheduled for completion in August 2011.

2. Johnny E. Osuna Memorial Park Master Plan Update

Carl Swenson, City Manager, introduced J.P. de la Montaigne, Community Services Director, to discuss the Osuna Park Master Plan. Mr. de la Montaigne explained that the City is trying to combine the traditional community square with the adjacent, modern theater. Osuna Park has been used for special events, and the design includes planning for the future events. Design elements include a sound wall, artistic fountain,

site furnishings, trees, shrubs and perennials, landscaping groundcovers and grasses, and restrooms.

Mr. de la Montaigne reviewed the project schedule. Construction is scheduled to begin in April 2011 and expected to be completed in September 2011.

3. Code Enforcement Update

Steve Kemp, City Attorney, led the discussion on code enforcement and outlined the legal framework. Constitutional and regulatory requirements of the federal law consist of federal mandates, equal protection, and due process. State restrictions on City authority includes property cleanup, state preemption on issues such as shopping cart impoundments, jurisdiction in real property matters, and limits on citations. Mr. Kemp summarized the City's roles and responsibilities:

- City Council — establish policy through enacting ordinances regulating conduct, addressing property standards, public health and safety
- City Attorney — implement council policy through the prosecution of cases under adopted ordinances and providing legal advice to Code employees
- Code Compliance — administer adopted council policy through inspection, notification, citizen contact, follow-up, enforcement and assisting with prosecution

Mr. Kemp presented an overview of the court system pertaining to criminal cases. Mr. Kemp reported the majority of code cases are resolved before going to court. In 2009 nine criminal cases were filed in the Municipal Court.

Mr. Kemp outlined current and upcoming proposals including: enhanced fines and penalties for nuisance violations, as well as a foreclosed home Ordinance providing for enhanced notification and maintenance procedures.

Mr. Kemp introduced Larry Ratcliff, Police Chief, and Jay Davies, Neighborhood Services Manager.

Chief Ratcliff described the organizational structure of the Police Department which includes the development of the Neighborhood Services section.

Jay Davies, Neighborhood Services Manager, discussed the incorporation of Code Enforcement to the Neighborhood Services section of the Police Department.

Mr. Davies explained the transition became a force multiplier, enhancing code and patrol functions.

Mr. Davies presented statistics on code violations and case load activities over a three-year period. One third of code cases are proactive verses two thirds resulting from complaints.

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Mr. Davies provided a timeline on voluntary and forced compliance from the initial inspection to final resolution. Discussion ensued on voluntary and forced compliance.

In closing, Mr. Davies gave a brief overview on backyard violations, abatement, and case management processes and provided a list of important phone numbers for direct assistance:
