


Sunrise Pool – 21321 N. 86th Dr. (623) 773-8495



RED – For young children who are not quite comfortable in the water. They have not learned to swim yet, and cannot float on their back. Sunrise offers a zero depth entry with water features to keep the kids entertained.

YELLOW – For children who are confident in the water, and stay afloat without struggling. If they reach the 42” height requirement, they are allowed to go on the slide. They have a little more freedom to move around the pool, but still remain in the shallower areas (4 foot depth).

GREEN – For very confident swimmers, who can swim across the pool. If they reach the 42” height requirement, they are allowed to go on the slide. They are also allowed in the main pool and off the diving boards. Greens are not allowed in the zero depth area.

Centennial Pool – 14388 N. 79th Ave. (623) 776-9555




RED – For young children who are not quite comfortable in the water. They have not learned to swim yet, and cannot float on their back. Centennial offers a zero depth entry with a mushroom water feature to keep the kids entertained.

YELLOW – For children who are confident in the water, and stay afloat without struggling. If they reach the 42” height requirement, they are allowed to go on the slide. They have a little more freedom to move around the pool, but still remain in the shallower areas (4 foot depth).

GREEN – For very confident swimmers, who can swim across the pool. If they reach the 42” height requirement, they are allowed to go on the slide. They are allowed anywhere in the pool except the zero depth area.

Peoria Pool – 11200 N. 83rd Ave. (623) 878-4903



RED – For young children who are not quite comfortable in the water. They have not learned to swim yet, and cannot float on their back. Peoria has a separate baby pool with water features for the kids’ enjoyment.

YELLOW – For children who are confident in the water, and stay afloat without struggling. Yellows are kept in the baby pool unless it is over-crowded, at which point a lane line is put in and they are allowed in the first 2 lanes of the big pool.

GREEN – For very confident swimmers, who can swim across the pool. They are allowed in the main pool and off the diving boards. Greens are not allowed in the baby pool.

American Red Cross certified lifeguards are on duty at all times. In addition, Summer Camp and Summer Rec staff will be present at the pools during all field trips.



A few things to remember....

- **Healthy Swimming** – Please do not send your child to the pools (or camp) if they are not feeling well. This jeopardizes the health of your child and everyone around them.
- **Wrist Bands** – Please read over the requirements for our wrist band distribution and assist lifeguards in assigning your child a wrist band color.
- **Swim Suits/Life-Jackets** – All floatation devices must be U.S. Coast Guard approved. “Floaty Suits” are NOT allowed. If necessary, the pool manager can provide a U.S. Coast Guard approved life preserver for your child.
- **Sunscreen** – Staff cannot apply sunscreen for your child. Please make sure to apply it in the morning, and show them how to re-apply before swim time.
- **Pool Rules** – All City of Peoria Pool Rules will be strictly enforced during swim times. For a complete list of rules, please visit www.peoriaaz.gov/aquatics.
